dead and 15 wounded seven of those killed were teenage boys the day became known as bloody sunday the events occurred in broad daylight and in the full glare of the press within hours the british military informed the world that they had won an ira gun battle this became the official narrative for decades until a family led campaign instigated one of the most complex inquiries in history in 2010 the victims of bloody sunday were fully exonerated when lord saville found that the majority of the victims were either shot in the back as they ran away or were helping someone in need the report made headlines all over the world while many buried the trauma of that day historian and campaigner juliann campbell whose teenage uncle was the first to be killed that day felt the need to paced unrelenting pulp noir in the fashion of nobody except greg barth shane d keene well satisfied with my position offers a first person account of army life during the civil war's peninsula campaign and battle of fredericksburg spencer bonsall who joined the 81st pennsylvania infantry as a hospital steward kept a journal from march 1862 until march 1863 when he abruptly ceased writing editors michael a flannery and katherine hoomens place his experiences in the context of the field of civil war medicine and continue his story in an epilogue trained as a druggist when he was in his early twenties bonsall traveled the world spent eight years on a tea plantation in india and settled in philadelphia where he worked in the city surveyor's office but in march 1862 when he was in his mid forties the lure of serving his country on the battlefield led bonsall to join the 81st pennsylvania infantry as a hospital steward bonsall enjoyed his life with the union army at first comparing bivouacking in the woods to merely picnicking on a grand scale we are about as jolly a set of old bachelors as can be found in virginia bonsall wrote but his first taste of the aftermath of battle at fair oaks and the seven days battles in virginia changed his mind about the joys of soldiering though he never lost his zeal for the union cause bonsall details the camp life of a soldier from firsthand experience outlines the engagements of the 81st and traces the battle of fredericksburg and the peninsula campaign he records facts not available elsewhere about camp conditions attitudes toward union generals and confederate soldiers and troop movements from the end of june to late october 1862 bonsall's illness kept him from writing in his journal he picked up the record again in december 1862 just before the battle of fredericksburg virginia in which the union suffered a staggering 10 200 casualties and the 81st pennsylvania lost more than half its men he vividly describes the bloody aftermath bonsall's horse was shot out from underneath him at the battle of gettysburg injuring him seriously and ending his military career although he was listed as sick in hospital on the regiment's muster rolls he was labeled a deserter in the u s

army records indeed after recovery from his injuries bonsall walked away from the army to resume life in philadelphia with his wife and child published for the first time bonsall s journal offers an unusually personal glimpse into the circumstances and motives of a man physically ruined by the war seventeen illustrations including some drawn by bonsall himself help bring this narrative to life edgar award finalist a true crime account of a vicious massacre and the legal battles that followed it was not a clever killing on may 5 1973 three men escaped from a maryland prison and disappeared joined by a fifteen year old brother they surfaced in georgia where they were spotted joyriding in a stolen car within a week the four young men were arrested on suspicion of committing one of the most horrific murders in american history jerry alday and his family were eating sunday dinner when death burst through the door of their cozy little trailer their six bodies are only the beginning of thomas h cook s retelling of this gruesome story the horrors continued in the courtroom based on court documents police records and interviews with the surviving family members this is a chilling look at the evil that can lurk just around the corner a history of the 1119 battle of the field of blood which decisively halted the momentum gained during the first crusade and decided the fate of the crusader states during the first crusade frankish armies swept across the middle east capturing major cities and setting up the crusader states in the levant a sustained western conquest of the region appeared utterly inevitable why then did the crusades ultimately fail to answer this question historian nicholas morton focuses on a period of bitter conflict between the franks and their turkish enemies when both factions were locked in a struggle for supremacy over the city of aleppo for the franks aleppo was key to securing dominance over the entire region for the turks this was nothing less than a battle for survival without aleppo they would have little hope of ever repelling the european invaders this conflict came to a head at the battle of the field of blood in 1199 and the face of the middle east was forever changed robert thorne coryndon born in south africa in 1870 served twenty eight years as the top ranking administrator of african dependencies a career unmatched by any other british colonial governor governors were expected through a combination of good sense and good character to exercise rule over dependent peoples in an honest and impartial manner an amalgam of liberal values and autocratic methods which lent a certain ambiguity to british imperial rule in africa and elsewhere during his rule in barotseland 1897 1907 under cecil rhodes british south africa company coryndon confronted the problems of establishing a colonial regime in 1914 1915 during the last seven years of his swaziland appointment he served as chairman of the land commission that delineated the boundaries of african reserves in southern rhodesia as governor of uganda during a time of rapid economic expansion 1917 1922 he set up legislative and executive councils and as governor of kenya 1922 1925 he formed local native councils as an experiment in indigenous administration this first full length study of coryndon is neither a traditional gubernatorial biography of a favoured son of the imperial school nor an ideological history of colonial oppression instead youé sets out to analyze coryndon s relationships with african rulers white settlers indian traders and metropolitan officials in order to assess the impact of his administrations on the territories he governed and to delineate the constraints on proconsular rule stephen owen is james bryant conant professor of chinese at harvard university book jacket in the bloody aftermath of an unsuccessful rebellion against rattan mad king of sandakar jubal khan is pursued by king rattan s special directorate thugs khan has no choice but to begin organizing another revolt because there is no safety in flight on 5 and 6 may 1864 the union and confederate armies met near an unfinished railroad in central virginia with lee outmanned and outgunned hoping to force grant to fight in the woods the name of the battle wilderness suggests the horror of combat at close quarters and an inability to see the whole field of engagement even from a distance indeed the battle is remembered for its brutality and ultimate futility for lee even with 26 000 casualties on both sides the wilderness only briefly stemmed grant s advance stephen cushman lives fifty miles south of this battlefield a poet and professor of american literature he wrote bloody promenade to confront the fractured legacy of a battle that haunts him through its very proximity to his everyday life cushman s personal narrative is not another history of the battle if this book is a history of anything he writes it s the history of verbal and visual images of a single particularly awful moment in the american civil war reflecting on that moment can begin in the present with the latest film or reenactment but it leads cushman back to materials from the past writing in an informal first person style he traces his own fascination with the conflict to a single book a pictorial history he read as a boy his abiding interest and poetic sensibility yield a fresh
